## From the Prophets Desk



For everything in life, we face struggle. One of the greatest struggles I've had is trying to develop people; getting them to a place that I know God is calling them to be. In Matthew 8 the man said, "I will follow You wherever You go." And Jesus responded that the Son of Man does not have a place to lay his head.

My struggle, Jesus is saying, that I'm looking for a place I can take my concepts to, what is in my head. I have these insights. It's easy to say, "I'm going wherever you are going" Foxes and birds have the ability to produce little foxes and birds, but Jesus is struggling to produce little 'Christs.' you know that God has given you and anointing, a message, a mandate, and a mission.

It takes year after year trying to elevate people. God is going to elevate you in the midst of your people because what you say he has got to demonstrate so people can hear it and see it. Here is the challenge: many times the people you are ministering to can look at you and say "Can any good thing come out of Nazareth?" They don't understand how God is elevating you. Anytime a ministry is going to increase a wealth transfer will come, which involves several things. What every ministry needs from time to time is the transfer of gifted people. Once you see gifted people being transferred into your life, you have to be able to manage them. We now command into this room on every leader gifted people, from every sector, to come into your church, and I command you to have grace to manage the gifts. Wealth transfer also comes with land and responsibilities of that land, a promise land. We now put a demand in the heavens in this place: every leader who needs a building; we declare that there is a transfer of buildings. The third thing in a wealth transfer is financial revenue. God is paying for the vision and mandate He has given you. Luke 8:1-3 says there were powerful women who traveled with Jesus. They showed up and came with some serious money. In essence, they said, "We are coming to join you ourselves to this ministry, but You don't have a place to lay your head, so we are going to throw some money at You." "I now put a third demand in the heavens in this room. A supernatural heaven will open over your heads, and God is about to send you some money! The struggle that you have are necessary because it is part of the process. Weeping has to endure for a night but every now and then joy has to come. You can't struggle always. At some point you have to have a victory. At some point, Isaac, you have to open the well you have been building. Jesus said "the Son of Man is looking for some place to lay His head, and I'm a candidate. Fruitfulness for the Mantle.

- **ACLU SUING AK . OVER GAY ADOPTION BAN**

- **LITTLE ROCK, Ark.** - More than a dozen families filed a lawsuit Tuesday challenging a new Arkansas law banning unmarried couples living together from becoming foster or adoptive parents.

The Arkansas chapter of the American Civil Liberties Union filed the lawsuit on behalf of the families in Pulaski County Circuit Court seeking to overturn Act 1, which was approved by voters in last month's general election.

"Act 1 violates the state's legal duty to place the best interest of children above all else," said Marie-Bernarde Miller, a Little Rock attorney in the lawsuit.

The group filed the lawsuit on behalf of 29 adults and children from more than a dozen families, including a grandmother who lives with her same-sex partner of nine years and is the only relative able and willing to adopt her grandchild, who is now in Arkansas state care.

The plaintiffs also include Stephanie Huffman and Wendy Rickman, a lesbian couple raising two sons together who want to adopt a foster child from the state.

"It's just wrong. It's an injustice," said Huffman, who lives in Conway. "I'm being denied an opportunity to provide a home for a special-needs child."

The families claim that the act's language was misleading to voters and that it violates their constitutional rights. The lawsuit was filed against the state of Arkansas, the attorney general, the Arkansas Department of Human Services and its director, and the Child Welfare Agency Review Board and its chairman.

The Arkansas Family Council, a conservative group that campaigned for the ban, said it was aimed at gay couples but the law will affect heterosexuals and homosexuals equally.

Jerry Cox, the council's president, said he had expected a lawsuit to be filed if the measure passed.

"We are confident this lawsuit will fail and Act 1 will remain on the books," Cox said.

Rita Sklar, ACLU Arkansas' executive director, said the group wanted to file the lawsuit before the law takes effect Thursday. Department of Human Services officials have said they do not expect to have to remove any foster children from their homes. The state had already barred cohabiting unmarried couples from becoming foster parents and was in the process of reversing that policy when voters approved the new ban. The law does not affect any adoptions that were finalized before it takes effect.

The ACLU had represented four plaintiffs in a lawsuit that led the state Supreme Court to overturn the state's ban on gay foster parents in 2006. The Family Council had campaigned for the initiated act in response to that ruling.

The lawsuit challenging Act 1 was assigned to Pulaski County Circuit Judge Timothy Fox, who had initially overturned the gay foster parent ban.

The ACLU's suit notes that the council had pushed for the new law as part of a campaign to blunt a so-called "gay agenda," but the restriction affects heterosexual and homosexual couples equally.
