

Remembrance Regardless 2 Peter 1:12 - 20

Wherefore I will not be negligent to put you always in remembrance of these things, though ye know them, and be established in the present truth.

- Negligent - Dereliction of duty: the shameful failure to fulfill one's obligations.
- Remembrance always, despite your knowledge
- Remembrance causes one to be Establish **sterizo** "to fix, make fast, to set" (from sterix, "a prop"), is used of "establishing" or "stablishing" (i.e., the confirmation) of persons;

¹³ Yea, I think it meet, as long as I am in this tabernacle, to stir you up by putting you in remembrance;

- It is only right; it is fitting or suited due to the time Peter had to prioritize his conversations to get people to remember divine encounters and truths known.
- The purpose was to stir you up till you are blended with the proper consciousness of God. Or to remain in an alerted state of mind.

¹⁴ Knowing that shortly I must put off this my tabernacle, even as our Lord Jesus Christ hath shewed me.

- For Peter his rapture was in view and his time was limited and he wanted to make the most of the time allotted him which he said was short.
- Note that God showed it to him and had to let him know due to the very practice he kept in exhorting others.
Remembrance: Paul had time to remember because he is incarcerated

The First **Remembrance**

Acts 5

¹⁸ And laid their hands on the apostles and put them in the common prison.

¹⁹ But the angel of the Lord by night opened the prison doors, and brought them forth, and said,

²⁰ Go, stand and speak in the temple to the people all the words of this life.

The Second **Rememberance** ² And he killed James the brother of John with the sword.

³ And because he saw it pleased the Jews, he proceeded further to take Peter also. (Then were the days of unleavened bread.)

⁴ And when he had apprehended him, he put him in prison, and delivered him to four quaternions of soldiers to keep him; intending after Easter to bring him forth to the people.

⁵ Peter therefore was kept in prison: but prayer was made without ceasing of the church unto God for him.

⁶ And when Herod would have brought him forth, the same night Peter was sleeping between two soldiers, bound with two chains: and the keepers before the door kept the prison.

⁷ And, behold, the angel of the Lord came upon him, and a light shined in the prison: and he smote Peter on the side, and raised him up, saying, Arise up quickly. And his chains fell off from his hands.

⁸ And the angel said unto him, Gird thyself, and bind on thy sandals. And so he did. And he saith unto him, Cast thy garment about thee, and follow me.

⁹ And he went out, and followed him; and wist not that it was true which was done by the angel; but thought he saw a vision.

Rememberance: Based on his remembrance His expectation was Release.

Rememberance: Unless God says otherwise seek Deliverance

The Lord had to show him otherwise – Not This Time

¹⁵ Moreover I will endeavor that ye may be able after my decease to have these things always in remembrance.

- The principles of the faith are to be meditated on with the full expectation of what God has said and God's ability to deliver not the circumstances surrounding.

¹⁶ For we have not followed cunningly devised fables, when we made known unto you the power and coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, but were eyewitnesses of his majesty.

- You can put your full trust in his promises and know for assurance that this is not a fairy tale but the stark reality of life itself and the power of the living God.

¹⁷ For he received from God the Father honour and glory, when there came such a voice to him from the excellent glory, This is my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased.

- You may have never heard him say this to you but the acceptance of Jesus Christ into your life you are one with him and therefore God decree's that he is well pleased with you. You would never invite him in if to the contrary.

¹⁸ And this voice which came from heaven we heard, when we were with him in the holy mount.¹⁹ We have also a more sure word of prophecy; whereunto ye do well that ye take heed, as unto a light that shineth in a dark place, until the day dawn, and the day star arise in your hearts:

- " Take Heed"
- Keep going over and over this in your mind. By keeping in in Rememberance "Thy Word Have I Hid" something profound happens that is metamorphic and transforming- UNTIL the daystar Jesus is pervasive in the heart. Surrender (Peter demonstrates a heart where the daystar has arisen)

²⁰ Knowing this first, that no prophecy of the scripture is of any private interpretation.²¹ For the prophecy came not in old time by the will of man: but holy men of God spake as they were moved by the Holy Ghost.
